Information for Prospective Referrers

- The "Reaching Up", Community Mentoring Project seeks to address
 the needs of parents and their families of all backgrounds especially from Black / Mixed heritage and other Minority Ethnic background (including Traveller); parents who might benefit from having someone to talk to on a regular basis about concerns, dreams and ambitions.
- We recruit, train and match adult mentors, to listen, support and encourage parents without judgement.
- Our project covers St Albans, Broxbourne and Welwyn Hatfield communities.
- Mentors will need to clear Criminal Records Bureau checks before they can start work with us.

What is A Mentor?

"A mentor is a guide; an advisor, someone on our side; loyal, interested, trusted and most importantly, experienced in areas that you may not be."

How does it work?

"Mentoring is a non-judgemental relationship in which an individual voluntarily gives time to support and encourage another. This relationship is typically developed at a time of transition in the mentee's life, and lasts for a significant and sustained period of time" (Home Office)

The mentor and the parent will arrange <u>regular meetings</u> at the previously agreed venue lasting between 20 and 45 minutes, typically on a weekly basis for as long as the parent feels comfortable. Minimum of 8 sessions is preferred.

Mentoring is an entirely voluntary relationship
